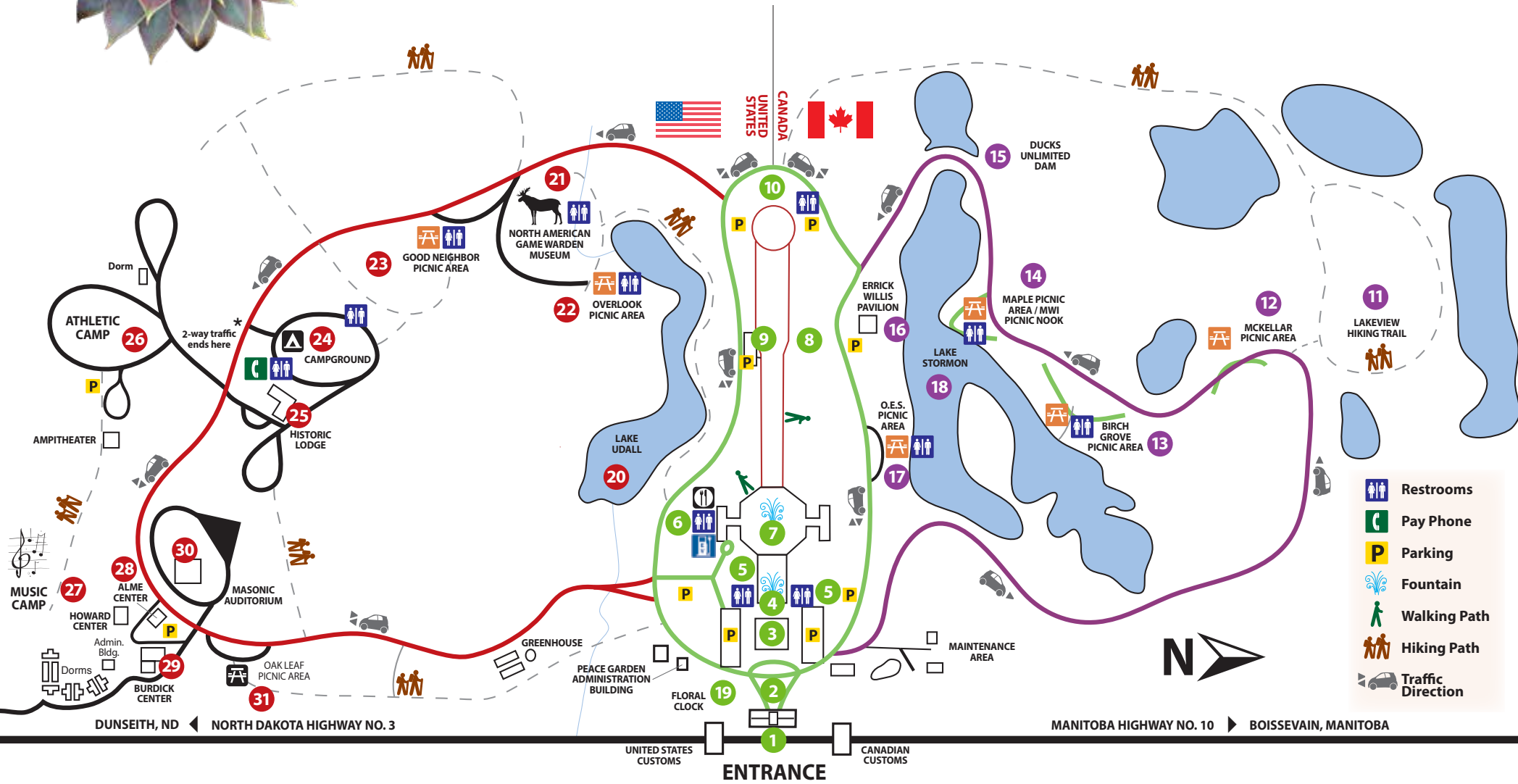

## South Drive (3.1 miles / 5 kilometers)

- 20 Lake Udall** Hand dug in 1934 by the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC). Named after W.V. Udall, of Boissevain, Manitoba.
- 21 North American Game Warden Wildlife Museum** Seasonal

- 22 Overlook Picnic Area** Sponsored by the North Dakota Order of the Eastern Star
- 23 Good Neighbor Picnic Area**
- 24 Campground** Enjoy serenity with all the amenities for a comfortable stay
- 25 Historic Lodge** Oldest building on site, built by the CCC in the 1930's
- 26 Legion Athletic Camp** Hosts over 600 athletes annually with instruction in multiple sports

- 28 Alme International Arts Centre** Music Library, Composers Computer Lab & Timmerman Theatre
- 29 Quentin Burdick Performing Arts Center** 510-seat auditorium
- 30 Masonic Auditorium** Sponsored by the Grand Lodge of Masons of North Dakota and Manitoba, seats 2,000
- 31 Oak Leaf Picnic Area**



## Formal Garden (1.5 miles / 2.4 kilometers)

- 1 Entrance** Built and dedicated by the Odd Fellows and Rebekahs of the World
- 2 Cairn** "Grand Opening Marker" from the July 14, 1932 dedication
- 3 Peace Poles** Presented by the Japanese government "May Peace Prevail"
- 4 Promise of Peace Sculpture** Dedicated in July 2016 by Wally Byam Caravan Club International
- 5 Historical Interpretive Centers** Under construction; restrooms open
- 6 Conservatory & Interpretive Center** Thousands of succulents and cacti, restaurant, gift shop and horticulture library
- 7 Sunken Garden Area** Fountain pool, landscaped with thousands of plants  
**Pollinator & Kitchen Garden** Helps supply the Borderwalk Cafe at the Interpretive Centre
- 8 Carillon Bell Tower** A 1976 Bicentennial project of the North Dakota Veterans' Organization
- 9 9/11 Memorial Site** Steel girders from New York City's former Twin Towers, Sponsored by Rotary Clubs of Minot and Brandon
- 10 Peace Chapel** Sponsored by the General Grand Chapter Order of the Eastern Star. Tyndall Stone walls are embedded with marine fossils and inscribed with quotes
- 19 Floral Clock** 18 feet high, design changes annually

## North Drive (3.5 miles / 5.6 kilometers)

- 11 Lakeview Hiking Trail** 1.5 mile / 2.4 kilometer trail with an abundance of birds and wildlife
- 12 McKellar Picnic Area** Named after a Manitoba legislator, Earl McKellar
- 13 Birch Grove Picnic Area**
- 14 Maple Leaf Picnic Area** Sponsored by the Federated and Manitoba Women's Institute
- 15 Ducks Unlimited Dam** Installed by Ducks Unlimited of Canada in 1967
- 16 Errick F. Willis Pavilion** Canadian Centennial Building named after a former lieutenant governor of Manitoba



- 17 OES Picnic Area** Sponsored by the Manitoba & Saskatchewan Order of the Eastern Star
- 18 Lake Stormon** Man-made lake, named after Judge John Stormon of Rolla, North Dakota
