

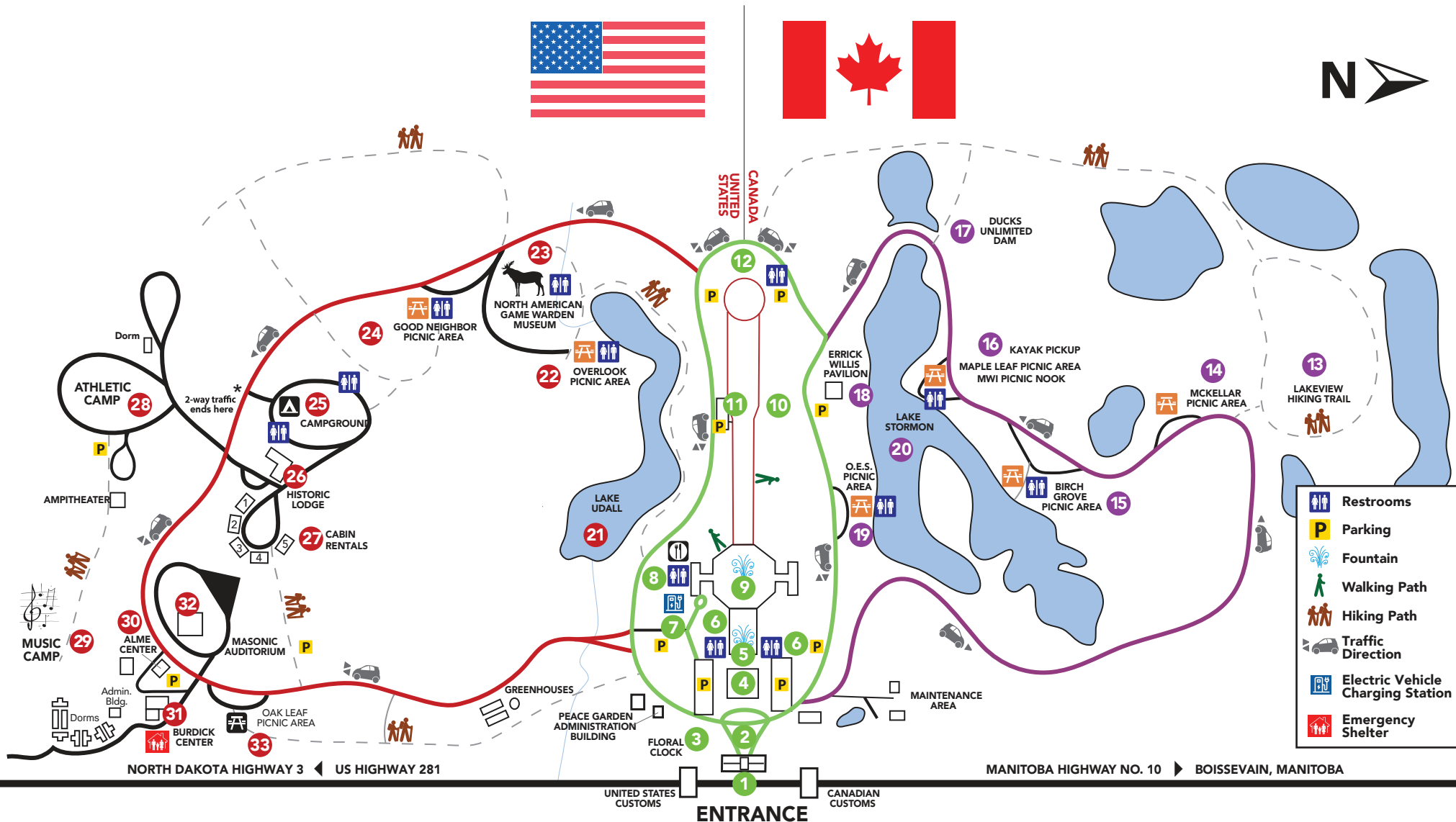


90th Anniversary 1932-2022

South Drive (3.1 miles/5 kilometers)

- 21 **Lake Udall** Hand dug in 1934 by the Civillian Conservation Corps (CCC). Named after W.V. Udall, of Boissevain, Manitoba
- 22 **Overlook Picnic Area** Sponsored by the North Dakota Order of the Eastern Star
- 23 **North American Game Warden Wildlife Museum** Seasonal 701.263.4829; gamewardenmuseum.org
- 24 **Good Neighbor Picnic Area** Sponsored by the Business and Professional Women's Federation
- 25 **Campground** Enjoy serenity with all the amenities for a comfortable stay; peacegarden.com/camping
- 26 **Historic Lodge** Oldest building on site, built by the CCC in the 1930's
- 27 **Cabin Rentals** Four cozy (3) and (4) bedroom cabins available for rent October through April peacegarden.com/cabins
- 28 **Former Athletic Camp** Operation opportunities are available; Call if interested at 1-800-432-6733
- 29 **International Music Camp** Summer School of Fine Arts, instructing more than 2,100 students annually internationalmusiccamp.com; 701.838.8472
- 30 **Alme International Arts Center** Music Library, Composers Computer Lab & Timmerman Theatre 701.838.8472
- 31 **Quentin Burdick Performing Arts Center** 500-seat auditorium; emergency shelter
- 32 **Masonic Auditorium** Sponsored by the Grand Lodge of Masons of North Dakota and Manitoba
- 33 **Oak Leaf Picnic Area** Sponsored by the North Dakota Homemakers Extension Council



Formal Garden (1.5 miles/2.4 kilometers)

- 1 **Entrance** Built and dedicated by the Odd Fellows and Rebekahs of the World
- 2 **Cairn "Grand Opening Marker"** from the July 14, 1932 dedication
- 3 **Floral Clock** 18 feet high, design changes annually
- 4 **Peace Poles** Presented by the Japanese government, "May Peace Prevail on Earth"
- 5 **Promise of Peace Sculpture** Dedicated in July 2016 by Wally Byam Caravan Club International
- 6 **Seasonal Public Washrooms**
- 7 **Children's Nature Play Park** Distinct animal habitat play zones nestled into an existing forest grove
- 8 **Conservatory & Interpretive Centre** Thousands of succulents and cacti, restaurant, gift shop and historical and art exhibits; available for rentals
- 9 **Sunken Garden** Fountain Pool, landscaped with thousands of perennial flowers and plants
Pollinator & Kitchen Garden Helps supply the Café with fresh herbs and vegetables
- 10 **Carillon Bell Tower** A 1976 Bicentennial project of the North Dakota Veterans' Organization, plays on the quarter hour
- 11 **9/11 Memorial Site** Steel girders from New York City's former Twin Towers, Sponsored by the Rotary Clubs of Minot and Brandon
- 12 **Peace Chapel** Tyndall Stone walls are embedded with marine fossils and inscribed with quotes; Sponsored by the General Grand Chapter Order of the Eastern Star

North Drive (3.5 miles/5.6 kilometers)

- 13 **Lakeview Hiking Trail** 1.5 mile/ 2.4 kilometer trail with an abundance of birds and wildlife
- 14 **McKellar Picnic Area** Named after a Manitoba legislator, Earl McKellar
- 15 **Birch Grove Picnic Area** Sponsored by Daughters of the British Empire
- 16 **Maple Leaf Picnic Area** Kayak pickup; Sponsored by the Federated and Manitoba Women's Institute
- 17 **Ducks Unlimited Dam** Installed by Ducks Unlimited of Canada, a global force in wetlands and wildlife conservation
- 18 **Errick F. Willis Pavillion** Overlooks Lake Stormon; Canadian Centennial Building named after a former Lieutenant Governor of Manitoba



- 19 **OES Picnic Area** Sponsored by the Manitoba & Saskatchewan Order of the Eastern Star
- 20 **Lake Stormon** Named after Judge John Stormon of Rolla, North Dakota, who was instrumental in the early development of the Garden during his sixteen years as IPG president
